The Real Work of Leading Change

This is an exciting time to be living and working, especially in medical education. All organizations are currently facing escalating challenges in a world characterized by volatility, uncertainty, complexity and ambiguity (VUCA). In this VUCA world, it's hard to predict what will happen next; the future is often not like the past and the scale of disruption is large as the speed of charge centingers to increase. is large as the speed of change continues to increase. For the foreseeable future change is an inevitable part of our life demanding meaningful, practical and effective ways to lead change. There is no better time for a reality check on what it will take to usher in the new era in medical education and empower stakeholders to build energy and readiness to make real change happen. Drawing on the successful practices of global change leaders this session will attempt to bust these myths about change and turn the conventional approach on its ear. 
Leveraging User-Centered Design in Medical Education

Steve Jobs asserted that "Design is not just what it looks like and feels like. Design is how it works." This statement is pertinent because across many industries solutions and services are being implemented with a lack of understanding about how they actually work in the real world—and thus, the service or solution fails. There is a growing movement within both technology and business domains to leverage humancentered design thinking and approaches. What does this mean for medical education? Often medical education curriculum is developed with a one-dimensional focus on what the student needs to learn and when they need to learn it. What is lacking is a multi-dimensional view that comes from human-centered design that views learning and curriculum through the eyes and the journey of the student (the user) and the faculty (those delivering learning). Design thinking unleashes medical educators to see curriculum and supporting technology with new vision and innovative ideas, many that stem from technology enabled learning environments.




